

Looking Ahead

The past year has been full of all kinds of different happenings.

There is no way to possibly include everything that has happened, but here is an overview of the bigger events of the year. In a year like this, is there anything we need to do but remember?

The highlights of this year would have to be the musical events. It was a year full of weekly worship music but also a number of special events.

In September, Michael Card came to do a two-day Biblical Imagination
Conference, which concluded with a concert on Sunday evening. The BI team did an absolutely amazing job connecting us with the biblical narrative in a vibrant, interactive way.

Then, in October we hosted Steve Green and Dick Tunney for a Sunday evening concert. We assembled a twelve-person choral group who accompanied Steve during the evening. It was a great time of refreshing.

On Easter, we put together an a capella vocal group who led worship for the day. Their ministry was powerful, with many commenting on the quality and impact of the worship time.

Jan Bell has been asked to step into the role of treasurer, taking over for Lori Jones.

Ministry Updates

Family Bible Study

On April 16, 2013, we began our Tuesday evening Family Bible Study. The purpose of the Family Bible Study was to provide a place for discussion, fellowship and prayer during the week. On average, about twenty people gather every week and spend an hour connecting and praying. Beside the main group led by Greg Jones and Steve Rambikur, Lee Farrar leads a children's discussion, and the music team meets for rehearsal.

Ladies' Bible Study

During the last year, 7-8 ladies continued to meet on Tuesday mornings for a Bible study. They have gone through several studies including the following:

Encouraging One Another, Dealing with Difficult People, and Living with Confidence in a Chaotic World.

God's Backyard

For the past few years, our Sunday children's ministry (God's Backyard) has studied a couple of different things, but without a structured curriculum. Beginning in September, we will be using the "Answers" curriculum published by Answers in Genesis.

This curriculum is a three-year cycle of basic Biblical knowledge, designed to be both interactive and constructive.

structure of the Bible and
foundational doctrine.


Youth Group

In the past year, 7-8 teens have met with the Donahues and Ray Brown on Sunday evenings. They have studied the following: *Nine Things Teens Should Know*, and the Biblical books of Matthew, Proverbs and Job. The teens have been involved in various work projects and activities, including a recent winter weekend where two teens professed Christ as their Savior and one rededicated himself to Christ.

Three seniors will graduate this year: Nicole Chase, Keith Donahue, and Isaac Wilcox. And after fourteen years, Sean and Dee Donahue will be stepping down from leading the youth group. The youth group will be in a period of transition, and Greg Jones will be providing further direction for this aspect of our ministry.

Since 2010, we have made significant improvements to our facility.

- New signage installed throughout the property
- Sanctuary windows were replaced
- The nursery was relocated to the family ministries wing
- The old nursery was converted into a conference room
- One of our two aging furnaces was replaced
- The kitchen was remodeled with a pass-through window
- Extensive repainting was done throughout the building

This past year, we have done a lot of small updates, including repairing the water damage from a burst pipe (and replacing the pipe with PEX, a plastic that will not break when the water inside freezes). We also did two *major* updates:

1. Remodeling the main bathrooms

Both bathrooms were completely gutted and rebuilt, literally from the ground up. New tile floors, partitions, counters, and fixtures were added. The result is a fresh, clean look that will last for years to come.

2. Carpeting the sanctuary

After years of fighting with curves and wrinkles that made the sanctuary unsightly and unsafe, we replaced the carpet with a

new, glued-down carpet with the same style and color as the carpet we put down on the stage in 2012. A team of about twenty volunteers removed the carpet.

Upcoming Projects

There are plenty of projects for us to tackle in the coming years. Here are a few:

- Replacing the windows downstairs.
- Rebuild the rotting structure of the sun room at the parsonage.
- New carpet installation in the education wing and downstairs.
- Replacing the aging furnace.
- Paving the parsonage driveway.
- Sealing and striping the church parking lot.
- Clean, repair and repaint the education wing bathrooms.














Missionary Visits & Updates

During July 2013, we welcomed three of our missionary families and were able to hear from them directly – the Posts, Swensons and Childs.

In October, Michael Knight – missionary to Namibia shared his vision for youth ministry there.

Nathan Arce and his family joined us in March and shared their ministry in Venezuela.

Missions Summary

Currently our congregation supports missionary families in five foreign fields — the Childs in East Asia, the Posts in Ireland, the Swensons in Japan, the Thompsons in Kenya, and the Arces Venezuela — as well as the Champeons who works to translate the Bible into languages that do not have it yet.

Beside these foreign missionaries, we have three domestic missions – Ted & Ruth Brewer with New Peace Network, Bill Paige with Community Chaplains, and our ministry to the women's prison in Goffstown.

We gave Michael Knight a one-time gift of \$1,000 to assist with his move to the field.

Local Missions Work

In April, we welcomed the men's choir from Teen Challenge. They shared their vision for ministry for people dealing with addiction and the work of God among them. A number of folks got their pictures taken with them and committed to pray regularly for them.

Sandy Misshula spearheaded a drive to assembly hygiene items and clothing for the survivors of the typhoon in the Philippines. We were able to give five full car loads of supplies to the Filipino-American Charitable Trust.

Our annual Operation Christmas Child drive was full of

opportunity to minister to children around the world. We collected 122 shoeboxes that were dedicated and delivered in November.

Missions Program Review

The average cost to send a missionary to a foreign field is somewhere around \$7,500-\$9,000 per month. The cost of living and ministry continues to rise, and at the same time, the resources of the local churches supporting missionaries seems to be dwindling. Our elders have asked the missions committee to review the status and support level of all of our missions projects with a view to create a support plan that will increase our commitment to our foreign missionaries, particularly those who are working in church planting and evangelism. We hope to be able to present this plan to the congregation at the semi-annual meeting, which will be held in November.



After years of service with the New Peace Network here in New England, Ted and Ruth Brewer relocated to California to be closer to their daughter and her family. Ted has remained on the board of New Peace and is developing a conciliation ministry in his new area.


October 11
