Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. · Hostile

Cannot please You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit,

So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh.

For if you live according to the flesh you will die, - DEATH but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. - LIFE

For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, - DEATH have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" - LIFE The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs-CELERRATES heirs of God The and fellow heirs with Christ, NOW/NOT YET provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him. For I consider that **the sufferings** of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God. was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardlyas we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. hope we were saved.


