Hungry I Come to You

VERSE 1: Hungry I come to You,
for I know You satisfy.
I am empty but I know
Your love does not run dry.
And so I wait for You. So I wait for You.

CHORUS: *I'm falling on my knees, offering all of me!
Jesus, You're all this heart is living for.*

VERSE 2: Broken I run to You
for Your arms are open wide.
I am weary but
I know Your touch restores my life.
And so I wait for You. So I wait for You.

Written from the perspective of the prodigal son (Luke 15:11-32), this song sees God as a father receiving his broken sons and daughters after they have wandered away and squandered their lives. Jesus's point in telling this parable, however, was not just to give hope to those who have lost everything. He also draws attention to the other son who never left home, but nonetheless has squandered the privileges he was granted in the father's house.

Immortal, Invisible

VERSE 1: Immortal, invisible, God only wise!
In light inaccessible, hid from our eyes!
Most blessed, most glorious, the Ancient of Days
Almighty, victorious,
Your great name we praise!

VERSE 2: Unresting unhasting, and silent as light
Not wanting, nor wasting, You rule us in might!
Your justice like mountains high soaring above;
Your clouds which are fountains
of goodness and love.

VERSE 3: To all life You give, Lord, to both great and small
In all life You live, Lord, the true life of all!!!
We blossom and flourish, uncertain and frail.
We wither and perish,
but You never fail.

VERSE 4: We worship before You, great Father of light
While angels adore You, all veiling their sight!
Our praises we render, O Father, to You
Whom only the splendor
of light hides from view!

This is a 19th century Scottish hymn, which draws from 1 Timothy 1:17 for its main text, but relies upon imagery from Psalm 104:2). It revels in the transcendent God who nonetheless causes all of creation, including us, to flourish. This is cause for a turn to worship, something we are able to do through grace.

El Shaddai

CHORUS: *El Shaddai, El Shaddai, El Elyonna Adonai,
age to age you're still the same,
by the power of the name.
El Shaddai, El Shaddai, erkamkana Adonai,
we will praise and lift you high, El Shaddai.*

VERSE 1: Through your love and through the ram,
you saved the son of Abraham.
Through the power of your hand
you turned the sea into dry land.
To the outcast on her knees,
you were the God who really sees,
and by your might you set your children free.

VERSE 1: Through the years you made it clear
that the time of Christ was near.
Though the people couldn't see
what Messiah ought to be.
Though your Word contained the plan,
they just could not understand,
Your most awesome work was done
in the frailty of your Son.

Set as a depiction of salvation history, this song passes quickly over the stages of salvation history (Abraham, the parting of the Red Sea) to see the woman accused of adultery whom Jesus defended by his silence (John 8:1-11). The opening line translates to "God Almighty, God of Gods," and the last verse expresses the work of Christ as the ultimate revelation of God's nature.

OPENING: Worthy, You are worthy,
King of kings, Lord of lords,

CHORUS: *I will give You all my worship.
I will give You all my praise

The words in parentheses are counterpoints to be sung against the lead line.

VERSE 1: I will worship (I will worship)
With all of my heart (with all of my heart)
I will praise You (I will praise You)
With all of my strength (all my strength)
I will seek You (I will seek You)
All of my days (all of my days)
I will follow (I will follow)
All of Your ways (all Your ways)

VERSE 2: I will bow down (I will bow down)
And hail You as King (and hail You as King)
I will serve You (I will serve You)
Give You everything (everything)
I will lift up (I will lift up)
My eyes to Your throne (my eyes to Your throne)
I will trust You (I will trust You)
Trust You alone (You alone)
