What is Worship, Really?

Worship is recorded in English before AD 900 (spelled worthscipe). The suffix -ship/-scipe is related to the word shape, with both coming from Dutch, meaning a form. (The same word underlies the word landscape).

In other words, worship has at its deepest root the idea of how we shape or form our declarations of worth. In the church setting, these are the declarations of God's worth.

In both Hebrew and Greek, there are two types of actions defined as worship. One is to bow down (Heb. $hhat{p}$); Gen 24:26; Gk. $hhat{p}$ 0; Gen 24:21) and the other is to take action, to create (Heb. $hhat{s}$ 1). Deut 12:4; Gk. $hhat{l}$ 13:3). Without a whole lot of examination, we can see that worship consists of two elements:

- Yes! We need to set aside time, both individually and corporately, when we bow before God and declare his worth through prayer, song, thanksgiving, confession. This is a necessary thing for us, because it centers us, reminds us of how we got here, who we are called to serve. We elevate God above ourselves and our wants and we join with the choir of the centuries in extolling his greatness.
- But our worship must also manifest itself in action, in work and creativity. Worship is not just something that we get for ourselves, a feeling or an emotion or intellectual realization. True worship moves us to do something about it—to declare God's worth through our own movement, creation, service, and proclamation.

At the end of the day, what we see and declare about God should become something that brings glory to Him in our daily lives. What that is, and what it looks like is not a definite thing; but we should give form or shape to our worship. Remember, there are no graven images in our faith. You were created in the image of God. You are the depiction of God's glory that others see.
