How to Read the Scriptures

In the medieval period, the Scriptures were being copied by hand, which meant they were tremendously expensive because they were so labor intensive to produce. The movable type press made copies much more affordable, and once the the Bible was translated into the "vulgar" or common languages of Europe, any literate person could read the Bible for themselves and see that many of the medieval teachings were not in Scripture.

There is a difference between the availability and accessibility of the Scriptures and the ability read them faithfully. The Scriptures are written *for* all people, but for people to understand them, they must be aware of the ways the Scriptures were written. At Bedford Road, we follow a grammatical-historical interpretation of Scripture.

- GRAMMATICAL-LINGUISTIC CONTEXT: Language is something
 we all use all the time, but it is actually quite complicated and
 nuanced. This is doubly true when something is translated.
 Knowledge not just of our language but the meaning and syntax of
 the biblical languages opens up the power of the text.
- HISTORICAL CONTEXT: Understanding the world into which the Scriptures were inspired is important. Words change in meaning over time, and imagery can lose its significance if we do not know what it is referring to. We also have to be aware of how the Scriptures were interpreted in the context between the author and his original audience and us. Often, our thinking is colored by events in this timeframe and our own; and we need to understand the original context to really get the depth of the text.
